At-risk children under two years old 	Sanofi Pasteur Quadrivalent Inactivated egg-based Influenza Vaccine (QIVe) 
Pre-school children from two years old 	AstraZeneca Quadrivalent Live Attenuated Influenza Vaccine (LAIV); Fluenz Tetra* 
All primary and secondary school children up to and including Year 12 	AstraZeneca Quadrivalent Live Attenuated Influenza Vaccine (LAIV); Fluenz Tetra* 
At-risk young people aged 16 and 17 years old. 	AstraZeneca Quadrivalent Live Attenuated Influenza Vaccine (LAIV); Fluenz Tetra* 
At-risk and eligible adults under 50 years old (including healthcare workers and pregnant women) and all adults aged 50 to 64 years old. 	Seqirus Quadrivalent Inactivated cell-based Influenza Vaccine (QIVc); Fluceivax Tetra 
Adults 65 years and older 	Seqirus Adjuvanted Quadrivalent Inactivated egg-based Influenza Vaccine (aQIV); Flud Tetra** 

*If medically contraindicated, individual should receive Seqirus QIVc.
**If contraindicated because of egg allergy, individual may receive Seqirus QIVc.
