

Cycling and Walking

There is a growing network of walking and cycling routes in Derry/Londonderry and the surrounding areas. With over 60km of routes (15km of which are traffic-free), getting around the city centre by foot and bike has never been easier or safer.

Shared use routes along Northland Road, Racecourse Road, Glengalliagh Road, Dungiven Road and the Skeoge/Crescent Link bypasses link the west and east to the traffic-free greenway network along the River Foyle. Routes 92 and 93) also run along the banks of the Foyle, leaving the city to the south.

The Peace Bridge

Spanning 235m across the River Foyle this iconic structure is the city's first dedicated foot and cycle

Connect2 Waterside Greenway

This tranquil, traffic-free path will connect communities in the east and west of the city via the Peace Bridge across the River Foyle.

Faughan Valley Cycleway

Three circular cycle routes in the Faughan Valley, passing Newbuildings, Mountcastle and Claudy Country Park before following the River Faughan back to the city.

Foyle Valley Greenway

This 34km route is made up of traffic-free paths and quiet country roads and lanes, starting at the Craigavon Bridge and following the line of the former Great Northern Railway with views of the River Foyle.

Inis Eoghain Cycleway

More than one-third of this route is traffic-free, and it passes through Ballyarnett Country Park, Newtowncunningham and Carrigans before following the Foyle Valley Greenway back into the heart of Derry.
