

The Service provides support to families and children affected by parental substance misuse.

The Service is funded by the Southern Drug & Alcohol Co-ordination Team, with it's purpose being to help families explore the impact of substance misuse on their lives and support them to make positive changes to ensure the safety and well- being of their children.

Barnardo's interventions are underpinned by systemic theoretical perspectives, whereby they consider individuals in the context of their family life, community and broader society. They use a range of techniques including Motivational Interviewing, Solution focused Brief Therapy, Cognitive Behavioural Therapy, Systemic Family Therapy and Groupwork. Their work methods are tailored to suit individual family need and can involve:

- 1. Specific relationship work (eg couples, parent/child)
- 2. Therapeutic family work including extended family
- 3. Individual work with both using and non using parents
- 4. Parenting support parent/couples/carers
- 5. Direct work with children (eg therapeutic, safety planning)
- 6. Group work interventions

Sessions with families and children are usually undertaken on a weekly basis and are approximately 1 – 1.5 hours in duration. An outreach service is provided using a range of statutory and community facilities across the Southern Trust and can also work with families in their own home.
