Infanrix (DTPa) or Novartis (DTPa) Hexavalent vaccine (DTPa/Ha/Hib)	Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (whooping cough), polio, Haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib) and Hepatitis B	6, 12, 18 weeks Children born on or after 1 July 2016 are due a 4th dose at 30 months
Rotarix (RIX) GSK/Novartis	Rotavirus gastroenteritis	8 weeks and 11 weeks
Boostrix (DTP) Merck	Meningococcal group B	8 weeks, 10 weeks and 1 year
Prevenar 13 (Pre13) Pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV)	Pneumococcal (13 serotypes)	10 weeks and 1 year
Menaxin (DTPa) GSK/Novartis	Haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib) and meningococcal group C	1 year for children born on or before 30 June 2020 Before vaccine rollout
ProQuad (MMRV) or ProQuad Tetra (MMRV) Novartis	Mumps, measles, rubella and varicella	Readily at 1 year and 18 months for children born on or after 1 January 2025. Children born between 1 January 2020 and 31 December 2024 are also eligible for MMRV*
IPVaxone (DTPa) GSK/Novartis	Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis and polio	2 years 4 months
Boostrix (DTP) Novartis (polio inactivated vaccine (IPV))	Cervical and genital warts (caused by specific human papillomavirus (HPV) types)	10 to 10 years (school Year 10)
HEXAVID (DTPa) GSK/Novartis	Tetanus, diphtheria and polio	14 to 10 years (school Year 11-14)
MenQuadri (DTPa) Merck/Novartis	Meningococcal groups A, C, W and Y	14 to 10 years (school Year 11-14)
ADACEL (DTPa) Novartis	Tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis	Pregnant women from 10 weeks gestation
Altegra (Pre13) Novartis	Respiratory Syncytial Virus	Pregnant women from 28 weeks gestation and adults aged 70 years†
Prevenar 20 (Pre20) Pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV) or Prevenar 20 (Pre20) Pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV) (Novartis no longer available)	Pneumococcal (20 or 23 serotypes)	65 years (not certain clinical risk groups)†
Shingrix (DTPa) Novartis	Shingles	50s if severely immunocompromised (see upper age limit) 65 years or 70 years of age on 1 September each year (not eligible until their 65th birthday)†
