Shingles Vaccination Surveillance in Northern Ireland End of Programme Year Report 2023/2024

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Introduction

This report provides an overview of the number of vaccinations administered and vaccine uptake for the Shingles vaccination programme in 2023/24. The programme year runs from 1st September 2023 to 31st August 2024.

The report includes information on the following eligible cohorts:

- 65 years
- 70 years
- •71-79 years
- Immunocompromised individuals aged 50 years and older

65 years - Shingrix vaccine




Figure 1. Cumulative uptake of Shingrix vaccination by week of vaccination in individuals aged 65 years by dose, 2023/24




Figure 2. Cumulative uptake of Shingrix vaccination in individuals aged 65 years by dose and LGD, 2023/24

There were 7,997 dose 1 and 5,263 dose 2 Shingrix vaccinations administered during the 2023/24 programme year to those aged 65 years of age. Vaccine uptake in this cohort was 38.9% for dose 1 and 25.6% for dose 2 (complete course). Vaccine uptake of dose 1 and dose 2 was highest in Lisburn and Castlereagh Local Government District (LGD), 49.5% and 35.5% respectively. The lowest vaccine uptake was reported in Fermanagh and Omagh LGD, 24.7% for dose 1 and 14.1% completing the course (Figures 1 and 2, and Tables 1 and 2).

70 years - Shingrix vaccine




Figure 3. Cumulative uptake of Shingrix vaccination by week of vaccination in individuals aged 70 years by dose, 2023/24




Figure 4. Cumulative uptake of Shingrix vaccination in individuals aged 70 years by dose and LGD, 2023/24

There were 7,195 dose 1 and 4,711 dose 2 Shingrix vaccinations administered during the 2023/24 programme year to those aged 70 years of age. Vaccine uptake in this cohort was 41.5% for dose 1 and 27.2% for dose 2 (complete course). Vaccine uptake of dose 1 and dose 2 was highest in Antrim and Newtownabbey LGD, 49.6% and 33.2% respectively. The lowest vaccine uptake was reported in Fermanagh and Omagh LGD, 32.3% for dose 1 and 18.3% completing the course (Figures 3 and 4, and Tables 3 and 4).

71-79 years - Shingrix vaccine

There were 3,754 dose 1 and 1,873 dose 2 Shingrix vaccinations administered during the 2023/24 programme year to those aged 71 -79 years of age. Vaccine uptake in this cohort was 2.8% for dose 1 and 1.4% for dose 2 (complete course) during 2023/24 (Tables 5 and 6). Individuals within this group will have been eligible for vaccination with either Shingrix or Zostavax prior to recording of vaccinations on VMS in August 2023, therefore it is likely many of those in the older age groups will have been previously vaccinated but not recorded on VMS.

71-79 years - Zostavax vaccine

Zostavax vaccine was used in those aged 71-79 years until stock was depleted. Zostavax was then discontinued and Shingrix became the only shingles vaccination on offer to all eligible cohorts. There were 703 Zostavax vaccinations administered during the 2023/24 programme year to those aged 71 -79 years of age. The proportion of this cohort vaccinated with Zostavax was 0.5% (Table 7). Individuals within this group will have been eligible for vaccination with either Shingrix or Zostavax prior to recording of vaccinations on VMS in August 2023, therefore it is likely many of those in the older age groups will have been previously vaccinated but not recorded on VMS.

Immunocompromised 50 years and older Shingrix vaccine




Figure 5. Cumulative uptake of Shingrix vaccination in immunocompromised individuals aged 50 years and older by dose and week of vaccination, 2023/24




Figure 6. Cumulative uptake of Shingrix vaccination in immunocompromised individuals aged 50 years and older by dose and LGD, 2023/24

There were 7,439 dose 1 and 5,930 dose 2 Shingrix vaccinations administered during the 2023/24 programme year to those immunocompromised aged 50 years and older. Vaccine uptake in this cohort was 22.4% for dose 1 and 17.9% for those completing the course. Vaccine uptake of dose 1 and dose 2 was highest in Lisburn and Castlereagh LGD, 29.0% and 23.5% respectively, The lowest vaccine uptake was reported in Mid Ulster LGD, 18.0% for dose 1 and Armagh, Craigavon and Banbridge LGD with 13.5% completing the course. Vaccine uptake was highest in those aged 65-69 years for both dose 1 (42.4%) and dose 2 (34.9%), it should be noted that individuals are also eligible based on age at 65 years (Figures 5 and 6, and Tables 8-11).

Vaccinations administered




Figure 7. Shingrix vaccine admininstered, by week of vaccination during 2023/24 Shingles vaccination programme.




Figure 8. Zostavax vaccine administered by week of vaccination during 2023/24 Shingles vaccination programme.

There were 27,333 Dose 1 and 17,515 Dose 2 Shingrix vaccinations and 924 Zostavax vaccinations administered during the 2023/24 programme year. Administration of dose 2 Shingrix vaccinations commenced later in the programme year as there is at least a six month interval between administration of doses. More dose 2 vaccinations were administered in the later half of the programme year. Shingrix dose 1 and 2 administration was greatest in Belfast LGD. The use of Zostavax vaccine was discontinued in 2023/24. (Figures 7 and 8, Tables 12 and 13).

Definitions and Methodology

Shingrix-for-all programme 2023/24 is any vaccine/dose administered from 1st September 2023 to 31st August 2024.

A complete vaccination course is defined as a single dose Zostavax or Shingrix dose 2 received.

Official start date of the Shingrix-for-all programme is 1st September 2023. Shingles vaccination recording in VMS was live from 30 August 2023. First vaccination records for 2023/24 begin 28 August 2023.

All vaccines are recorded on the Vaccine Management System. Data extracted 25/11/2024.

Cohorts are not mutually exclusive and therefore individuals may be counted in more than one cohort.

The population who are 'immunosuppressed' is determined using data from the national General Practice Improvement Programme (GPIP) extracted at the beginning of the 2023/24 programme year. Data is extracted from GPIP using SNOMED codes related to 'immunosuppression' based on recommendations within the <u>Green Book Chapter 25a Shingles</u>.
