 <b>Infanrix hexa (GSK) or Vaxelis (Sanofi)</b> Hexavalent vaccine DTaP/IPV/Hib/HepB	Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (whooping cough), polio, <i>Haemophilus influenzae</i> type b (Hib) and hepatitis B	<b>8,12,16 weeks</b>  <b>Children born on or after 1 July 2024 receive a 4th dose at 18 months</b>	
 <b>Rotarix (GSK)</b> Rotavirus (oral)	Rotavirus gastroenteritis	<b>8 weeks and 12 weeks</b>	
 <b>Bexsero (GSK)</b> MenB	Meningococcal group B	<b>8 weeks, 12 weeks and 1 year</b>	
 <b>Prevenar 13 (Pfizer)</b> Pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV)	Pneumococcal (13 serotypes)	<b>16 weeks and 1 year</b>	
 <b>Menitorix (GSK)</b> Hib/MenC	<i>Haemophilus influenzae</i> type b (Hib) and meningococcal group C	<b>1 year for children born on or before 30 June 2024 (while stocks remain)<sup>1</sup></b>	
 <b>ProQuad (MSD)<sup>2</sup> or Priorix Tetra (GSK)</b> MMRV	Measles, mumps, rubella and varicella	<b>Routinely at 1 year and 18 months for children born on or after 1 January 2025.</b> <b>Children born between 1 January 2020 and 31 December 2024 are also eligible for MMRV<sup>3</sup></b>	
 <b>REPEVAX (Sanofi)</b> dTaP/IPV	Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis and polio	<b>3 years 4 months</b>	
 <b>Gardasil 9 (MSD)</b> Human papillomavirus vaccine (HPV)	Cancers and genital warts caused by specific human papillomavirus (HPV) types	<b>12 to 13 years (school Year 9)</b>	
 <b>REVAXIS (Sanofi)</b> Td/IPV	Tetanus, diphtheria and polio	<b>14 to 18 years (school Years 11-14)</b>	
 <b>MenQuadfi (Sanofi)</b> MenACWY	Meningococcal groups A, C, W and Y	<b>14 to 18 years (school Years 11-14)</b>	
 <b>ADACEL (Sanofi)</b> Tdap	Tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis	<b>Pregnant women from 16 weeks gestation</b>	
 <b>Abrysvo (Pfizer)</b> RSV	Respiratory Syncytial Virus	<b>Pregnant women from 28 weeks gestation and adults aged 75 years<sup>4</sup></b>	
 <b>Pneumovax 23 (MSD)</b> Pneumococcal polysaccharide vaccine (PPV23) or <b>Prevenar 20 (Pfizer)</b> Pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV20) (once PPV23 no longer available)	Pneumococcal (23 or 20 serotypes)	<b>65 years (and certain clinical risk groups)<sup>5</sup></b>	
 <b>Shingrix (GSK)</b> Shingles	Shingles	<b>18+ if severely immunosuppressed (no upper age limit)</b> <b>65 years or 70 years of age on 1 September each year (remain eligible until their 80th birthday)<sup>6</sup></b>
